



John M. Browning in the First World War

Gus B. explored many little known aspects of John M. Browning's arms history. Although best known for his immortal Model 1911 pistol, lever action Winchester rifles, and automatic weapons, Browning's inventions saw wide foreign military use.

Seven different models of Browning pistols used in WW1 are shown here, along with two less well known longarms.

The Russian soldier at the left has one of the 300,000 Winchester Model 1895 muskets Russia purchased in in 7.62x54mm caliber. This one was used by the Russians in WW1 (and later sent for use in the Spanish Civil War 1936-39!).

The figure on the right is a U.S. Marine with a Winchester Model 1897 "Trench Gun" used in combat and for guarding prisoners.







Have you seen this pistol?

A gentleman attended the January 2007 Utah Gun Collectors show in Ogden with pictures of the pistol shown below. He was in hopes of finding a buyer.



Since that time it has become known that the pistol was made for Erich Krempel as a commemorative prize for winning the silver medal in the 1936 Olympic Games held in Germany. After the Olympics Krempel became a nationally known shooting competitor and teacher. Erich Krempel was a resident and local hero of Suhl, Germany, his home town. In 1945 his trophy pistol was taken from Suhl as a war prize by an American GI. Somehow the pistol made its way to Ogden, Utah, and was seen at a Ogden gun show.

The City of Suhl will celebrate the 100th birthday of Erich Krempel in 2012. The Suhl Arms Museum has already made great progress in bringing together many of Krempel's memorabilia. The Museum would like to display the gun next year. It would be wonderful if they could find this commemorative pistol for their celebration.
